
From the Pastor's Desk

Historically, Lent was the time to 'give up something' of meaning. Then on Easter Sunday you'd joyously welcome back into your life what was given up (chocolate was always a favorite)! Over the years, I've not included this practice in my Lenten discipline. I find it more meaningful to engage more fully in faith by serving others so that through my 'death and resurrection' experiences I might change other lives. Early followers of the "Jesus Way" used lent to teach others about faith. Teachers and learners spent countless hours reflecting and engaging the message of God's love for all people, days on end. At the Easter Vigil (the Saturday night before the Resurrection Day) the learners would be baptized and welcomed into the Church. It was a time for the Church to celebrate these new disciples of Jesus!

Part of my Lenten discipline this year includes time to be challenged by the life and ministry of Jesus more fully. In recent months, I've been exposed to different readings about the Church and its role in the world. I sense Church has lost its commitment to Jesus. I wonder if the Church has lost its focus as Jesus followers of "The Way"? Has the church been afraid to speak out in the name of Jesus? I fear we've made Jesus in the image of a safe savior who makes us feel good, rather than the Jesus of scripture that challenges followers to be engaged in the daily lives of people.



Council highlights February 10, 2020

Treasurer Lynn Hibshman reported income in January was \$10,359.81, expenses were \$12,095.63, leaving a deficit of \$1,735.82.

Council approved tentative times for Holy Week services, including Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Final times will be announced next month. Council also approved inviting Holy Trinity, Salem and our two neighbor churches to attend the Sunrise service on Easter Sunday.

Bonnie Grater, Jane Pittman and Cathy Feather are members of the Worship and Music Leadership Team.

Council approved the bid of Mark Federer of Lititz of \$816.85 to re-line and repair the chimney in the parsonage. The funds for this will be taken from the Improvement Fund.

Council also approved Steve Smith's bid of \$983 to install four air conditioners in the downstairs rooms occupied by Penn DOT, as agreed in our original agreement with them.

Council also approved the request of Tom Perry, owner of Beam's Music Store, to use our facilities for guitar lessons Wednesday evenings from 5-8 PM. Remuneration will depend on the number of students.

For the Safety and Security of all who enter

We are living in a time when fear seems to be the operating factor whenever we engage with other people. At Bergstrasse, we are taking steps to ensure that we have appropriate measures in place to keep all people safe and secure. As these measures are worked out, we will do our best to inform you. It is everyone's responsibility to be aware of your surroundings. If something looks out of place, tell someone. Your council, and pastor will do our best to make appropriate changes.

Two measures currently in place:

- 1. In the event of an evacuation from Bergstrasse Church, move as quickly as possible to either the Parsonage or Sexton House. Once there, you will receive further instructions from church leadership, the police, or other safety authorities.
- 2. When using our building, it is helpful to have a person(s) in the entrance area for welcoming and to also give direction as necessary. Once the meeting or worship has begun, it is suggested to lock the doors. In the case of worship, those persons arriving late will be directed to enter through the original doors. Why are we doing this? It has been our practice to close the door to the sanctuary for worship. If the glass doors remain unlocked, anyone can enter, and move about freely without even entering the sanctuary! By entering the original entrance, persons are immediately faced with seeing someone. As for meetings or rehearsals, once everyone has arrived that you are expecting, please lock the doors. This is especially important if you are using the lower West door from the lower parking lot.

We appreciate your cooperation in these matters so that everyone feels safe when using our facility. Be aware of your surroundings and respond appropriately. The telephone in the lobby is for your use to notify police or contact 911.
