Life changes, shifts, transforms to become something new every day. Out of the past, new growth blossoms. The new, through habitual practice, eventually becomes normal. When are our practices named as normal? Especially when life seems to always be in flux. When O God, will we return to 'normal' the people cried out...seven months into a pandemic. It feels like we've been waiting forever to settle into a routine that feels familiar. One that could be navigated without hesitation, knowing what to expect. The known dies, so that resurrection is realized and believed. This is the story of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. AND it is our story today as our lives are being changed by an invisible coronavirus.

The familiar is always safe. Living in the unfamiliar requires perseverance, dedication, and patience while navigating unfamiliar territory. With a pandemic, no one is exempt. Everyone faces new

challenges. The Church is also facing new challenges. What seemed impossible to do seven months ago, now seems 'normal'. Congregational leaders discovered new ways of connecting with one another. In some ways, the pandemic forced congregations to examine how they minister in their communities. Technology, the use of digital communication, has changed how most if not all congregations share the Gospel of Jesus Christ – that all people are love, that God is with you.

With any change, there is a level of risk involved. Leaders of differing mindsets must come together for the benefit of everyone. Taking risks is leadership. Returning to in-person, indoor worship July 5 was a risk! At that time, many other congregations moved to other ways of gathering outdoors. Our online worship continued to bless persons not yet ready to gather indoors, as well as people from neighboring communities. As new habits become familiar, to remain diligent requires our attention. Washing hands often, wearing a face mask, and social distancing have become normal. Like all habits, sometimes we need to remind others to do the same...for the good of everyone.

Every day we are bombarded with information about the coronavirus. Statistics of new cases, deaths, number of hospitalizations, status of possible vaccines, how to keep your space safe, and so much more. With the fall season, many activities will move indoors with different practices to ensure everyone's safety. The constant in all this – God is with you! Jesus teaches we are not alone in our work of being. God's work is evidenced in our love and care for each other. You are constantly being transformed by God's Word. Being with God is risky business! Being love for each other in our action as well as our words take perseverance, dedication, and patience. What risks are you taking with God?

Under the Pines

Did you know the small grouping of pine trees behind our building is NOW an outdoor worship and gathering space?

Thanks to the efforts of Ben Gunzenhauser who last spring rid the area of two piles of brush, stones, and ivy, Ephrata Lutheran Ministry began offering Weekly Outdoor Worship!

Central to the space is a 'Table'. This 'table' once stood in the front lawn of Jane Pittman's mother's home as a pine tree. With the help of tree trimmers and John Gehr, knowing a sawmill willing to cut the log, we now have a beautiful natural table to gather around.

Why 'table' and not 'altar'? An <u>altar</u> is where offerings are made, including in sacrifices. A <u>table</u> is where Jesus gathered disciples to share in the Last Supper and where he met others for conversation. This space is more than a place for worship. It is a gathering place for fellowship too!

Christmas Eve 2020 at Bergstrasse

We are offering multiple worship opportunities to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child. It is our hope to be able to accommodate as many people for worship and still be within the safety guidelines for indoor activities.

3:00 pm AND 7:00 pm – A **Traditional Christmas Eve** worship including retelling Jesus' birth story, hearing traditional carols (no singing), Communion, and a candle lighting ritual. Weather permitting, we will gather outside around the Angel Statue where we will sing one verse of Silent Night, socially distanced and masked. For those who are able, we will begin to place the luminaries.

5:30 pm – **NEW!** We will gather OUTDOORS around the Angel Statue to again hear Jesus' birth story surrounded by light. A portion of this 40-minute service will include final placement and lighting of the luminaries. Details are still being formed. *If you would like to plan this service, contact Pastor Jim.

- 5. Christmas Eve Outdoor at Bergstrasse to include Community Lighting of Luminaries





Members present were Nevin, Dave, Almanara, Lisa and Pastor Jim

Lynn Hibshman plans to complete the report for the loan forgiveness this Saturday, Oct. 17th providing he can scan the needed information and enter it in the portal.

Almanara made a motion to approve the September treasurer's report and Nevin seconded it.

Nevin made a motion to approve the proposed 2021 budget and Almanara seconded it. Electronic giving capability is on the horizon.

Almanara made a motion to approve the secretary's report from September's meeting and Nevin seconded it.

The J.C. Eckman/PennDOT construction project is ahead of schedule.

Livestreaming the worship service is a work in progress.

Communion wine will not be reinstated yet. Only wafers will be used.

Growing through gratitude

Thankfulness, studies show, has multiple physical, mental and emotional benefits. Psychologist Robert Emmons calls gratitude "fertilizer for the mind" because of its powerful effects.

He admits gratitude isn't always easy — especially when life throws us curveballs (see the year 2020) — but says it can be most helpful during and after difficulties. Emmons suggests reframing challenges using thankfulness-based language. Ask, for example: Though I wasn't grateful for the experience at the time, how can I be now? What lessons did I learn, and how did I grow as a person?

Throughout his letters, the apostle Paul reframes his extensive sufferings and urges us to do the same. "Give thanks in all circumstances," he writes, "for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18, NIV).
