### **Bergstrasse Graveyard Trivia**

After the recent HGMC concert ended, a guest asked me if we had a list of the founders of Bergstrasse Church. I grabbed one of the red books, found the list, and sure enough, they said, "I think its Michel Oberlin. I'll check with my mother." Two days later, I receive a message that indeed Michel Oberlin is one of their ancestors! You know I shared that I too have an ancestor who founded Bergstrasse Church! The next day, they asked if we could meet. During that time, they mentioned they had done further research and discovered that Michel and his late wife Susanna are buried in the Bergstrasse Graveyard! Thanks to their research on the 'Find a grave' website and the resource book we have on hand, we discovered both Susanna and Michel ARE buried at Bergstrasse, just south of the original graveyard gate! Susanna's marker can be read, if you understand German; however Michel's is damaged and nothing remains of the writing, only history marking the spot where Michel was laid to rest.

I wonder how many of the other founders of Bergstrasse are buried in the adjoining cemetery? I do know Elias Meyer, my ancestor, is buried with his wife in the old Bethany Cemetery next to Ephrata Manor. Like the Oberlin's markers, Elias's wife marker can be read and his marker is missing!

A few weeks ago we celebrated Pentecost when the Holy Spirit appeared among God's people like a flame of fire ready to take on the world! It was a time of jubilation for the early followers of Jesus, marking the beginning of new life born in the resurrection of Jesus who ascended to be with God, who in turn sent the Holy Spirit to dwell among God's people so that they might be filled with the Spirit to create new meaning for life without the physical presence of Jesus.

On the Day of Pentecost, the sanctuary was adorned in red, quickly turning to green, representing growth into new life. Pentecost is the longest 'season' in the church that follows the Day of Pentecost and lasts until the last Sunday of the church

year, Christ the King Sunday. The church year is neatly divided into two sections, with the first section beginning with Advent, preparing for Jesus' birth, and lasting through the incarnation of Jesus (Epiphany), the time of trial, culminating in the resurrection of Jesus. We read and hear of Jesus' encounters with religious leaders, and the Roman authorities as he attempts to bring a new understanding of God to the people who usually have different ideas of being in relationship with God! The Pentecost Season follows by returning for a deeper dive into the experiences Jesus has with ordinary people throughout his ministry, traveling from Galilee to Jerusalem and everywhere in between. These experiences are often shared as parables, which may or may not have happened in real life! What we do know is they offer a way for us to better understand how the ancient people lived and encountered God.

Some faith traditions call this Pentecost season 'Ordinary Time', reserved for storytelling and sharing experiences of God's presence in the world. As  $21^{st}$  century people, our faith journey is guided by the Holy Spirit or the divineness in us. We are ordinary people in this ordinary time and ordinary place so that we can be examples of love and compassion in the world today. Not like yesterday, weeks, or months, decades or centuries ago...but TODAY! As we read the stories in scripture, allow the example of our ancestors to guide us. God loves you the way you are, no need to fit into a particular pattern, just be kind, loving compassionate and willing to show others that in this ordinary time. It is in the ordinariness of life that God shows up to make the ordinary extraordinary by your life example! Go, show the world that hope for new life exists.



**Bergstrasse Church** sits in one of the most beautiful settings in Lancaster County! High atop the hill in East Ephrata since 1752. This summer we will worship outdoors, on the lawn of the parsonage, three times to experience the great outdoors. Each worship service will be uniquely different. In the event of rain, we will move inside to the Fellowship Hall. Bring a lawn chair or blanket, dress comfortably for outdoors, and give praise to God.

**Sunday July 9** will feature Darla Bair sharing the Art of Drumming – yes, you might get to play a drum. No experience needed!

**Sunday August 13** is being planned. Possibly a camp style service using more of your favorite hymns!

**Sunday September 10** is God's Work, Our Hands Sunday where ELCA congregations provide community service for their neighbor. Plans are very tentative including gathering for brief worship at the Whistle Stop, scatter around Ephrata for 2-3 hours of community service, again gather for a brief worship to include a bagged lunch.
